


Wuhan tests nearly 10M citizens in 10 days

ANKARA - Nearly 10 million residents of Wuhan city in central China were tested for coronavirus over 10 days. "Wuhan has tested 9.89 million people during its ten-day citywide nucleic test campaign, found 300 asymptomatic carriers, and no confirmed

cases," a municipality official said, according to daily Global Times. The deadly coronavirus was first reported in Wuhan, the capital of Hubei province, last December.
